Both fairway neighborhoods must remain together in the same voting district.

As you know, Pacifica neighborhoods are historically (and geographically) organized in an east-west configuration. That is how our town (and Fairway) community of interest is defined and operates. Continuity of the entire Fairway neighborhood is required.

Please find attached the proposed 2018 Pacifica voting district map from the Fairmont Subdivisions Improvement Association.

Also attached is a spreadsheet showing the number of voters in each District per the Pacifica Map. Per the instructions they must be close to 7447 with no more than a 745 difference. The largest difference on this map between districts is 694.

Given the historically under represented North end of Pacifica, it would be just, fair and equitable to have the North end districts be placed in the 2020 voting sequence and NOT 2022 as this would be in keeping with the intent of the CA Voting Rights Act and remedy the underrepresentation situation sooner rather than later.

It was also rather difficult reviewing the maps as the program kept taking the page to City of Lake Forest Maps????? Also on the Pacifica 2018 Districting Project, that map is missing many numbers of voters that show up on the PDF map.

Please let me know if anything else is needed to be submitted for the map to be accepted.

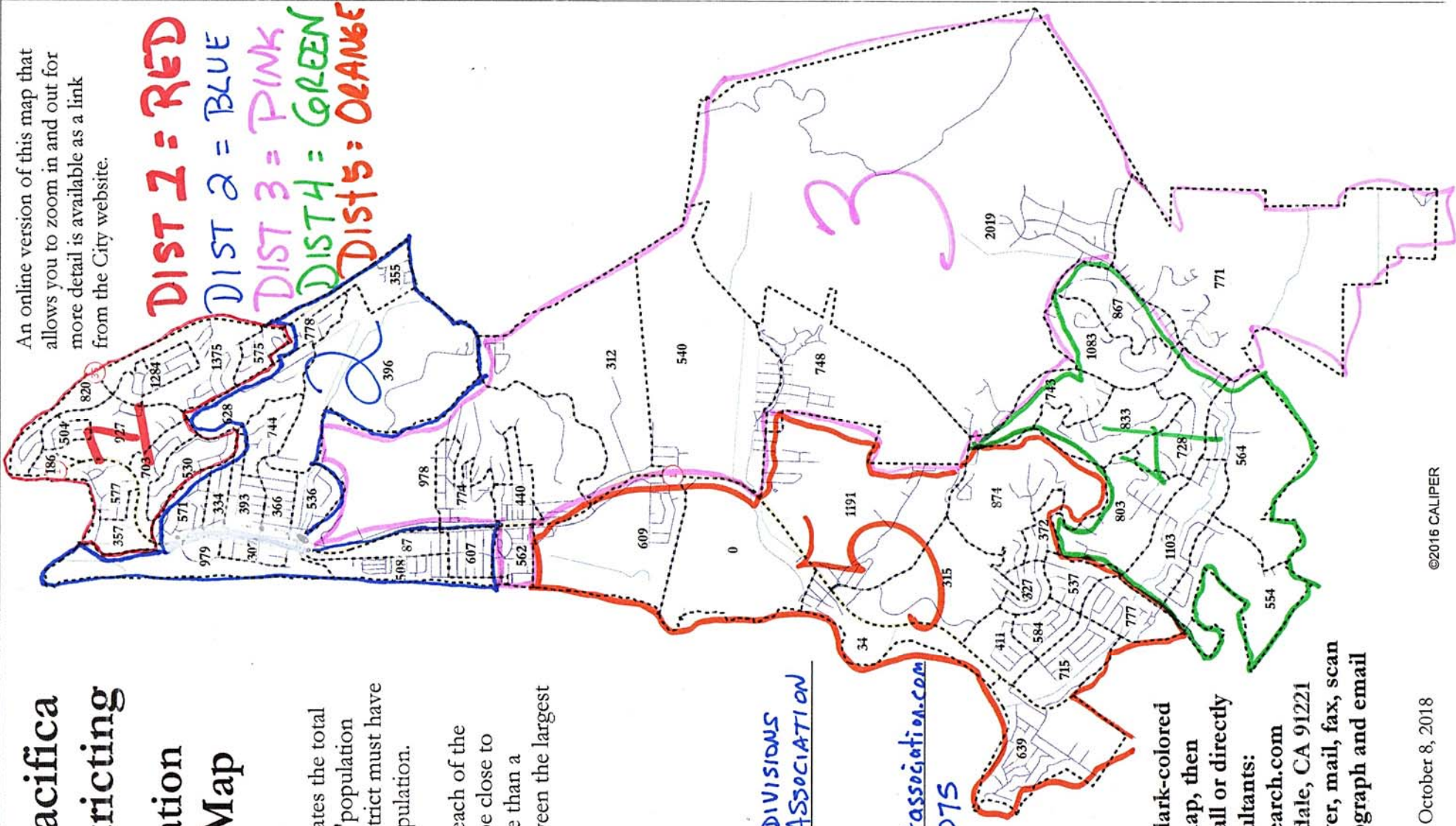
Population Units Map

The population of each of the five districts must be close to 7,447, with no more than a 745 difference between the largest and smallest.
