Subject: Lytt, LLC CAP #1-18

The Cannabis Public Safety License (CPSL) for Lytt, LLC is currently valid, expiring on November 29, 2020. The initial CPSL was issued on November 29, 2018. Lytt opened for business in September 2019 and renewed the CPSL in November 2019. As part of the CPSL renewal process, staff determined Lytt was in compliance with Pacifica Municipal Code Section 4-16.05(a), *Criteria for issuance*.

Per Section 4-16.03(c) (2), *Conditions of Operation/Nuisances Prohibited*, a licensee shall take reasonable steps to correct objectionable conditions that constitute a nuisance on any public sidewalk or public space abutting the cannabis operation premises. A search was conducted of Police Department calls for service at Lytt for the period of September 2019 through September 2020. A search was also conducted for calls for service for the same time period within an approximately three block radius of the business. Calls located were reviewed to determine if the calls or complaints were related to the business and if they involved consumption of cannabis in a public place, subject(s) under the influence of cannabis, loitering, etc. The calls for service/complaints were as follows:

- 1) December 22, 2019: Report of a vehicle in front of the business with someone smoking cannabis inside the vehicle. Officers located open cannabis in the vehicle. Lytt management was advised of the violation. Lytt management contacted the Chief of Police shortly thereafter to advise they had been made aware of the complaint and would monitor the area in front of their business.
- 2) December 26, 2019: A Lytt employee reported an irate customer yelling at employees. Customer was gone upon officer arrival.

- 3) January 20, 2020: Both Lytt management and a customer called to report this incident. The irate customer was upset over a product price dispute and because a security guard escorted her from the business when she refused to leave.
- 4) April 10, 2020: Lytt management reported subjects smoking cannabis in a vehicle in front of the business. When asked to leave, the occupants threatened the security guard.
- 5) April 18, 2020: A caller reported people in line for Lytt not adhering to social distancing. The officer found no merit to the complaint.
- 6) May 14, 2020: A Lytt employee reported a hostile customer who had been drinking. The customer was upset because he was refused service. The customer was gone upon officer arrival.
- 7) May 18, 2020: A caller reported Lytt employees were not wearing masks as required. Lytt management stated employees do adhere to proper protocol and wear masks when working,
- 8) July 16, 2020: Lytt management reported a subject outside of the business asking patrons for cannabis and money. Officers contacted the subject and asked him to leave.
- 9) August 7, 2020: A caller reported a Lytt security guard was not wearing his mask correctly. An officer spoke to the security guard, who corrected the issue.

Of these calls, five were as a result of Lytt employees/management informing the police department of a problem. Pacifica Municipal Code Section 4-16.03(c) (2) requires licensees to take reasonable steps to correct objectionable conditions that constitute a nuisance.” Further, 4-16.03(c) (2) (ii) (aa) states that timely calls to law enforcement placed by the licensee shall not be construed as evidence of objectionable conditions that constitute a nuisance. One call was placed regarding a cannabis violation in front of the business that Lytt was not aware of. The remaining three calls were related to complaints regarding COVID19 concerns, common throughout Pacifica during the pandemic.

Lytt staff and management have been cooperative and communicative with the Pacifica Police Department. The Chief of Police has no concerns regarding the operation of Lytt during the reviewed period.

Lytt, LLC maintains an Adult Use-Medicinal Retailer License issued by the Bureau of Cannabis Control (C10-0000108-LIC). This license expires on June 9, 2021.
